

## Pupil Premium 2011/2012

The Pupil Premium is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools to support specific groups of children who are vulnerable to possible underachievement. These include pupils who are entitled to free school meals; those looked after by the local authority and the children of armed service personnel.

For the academic year 2011/12, Rosa Street Primary School received £22,936 in Pupil Premium funding. This was used as follows:

Focus	Impact
To provide short-term intervention programmes for underachieving/attaining pupils.  <b>30%</b>	Increased outcomes in achievement and attainment for pupils in receipt of free school meals.
To provide one-to-one tuition for some pupils in Numeracy and Literacy.  <b>15%</b>	Increased outcomes in achievement and attainment for pupils in receipt of free school meals.
To provide booster sessions before school and after school to support pupils with Numeracy and Literacy.  <b>8%</b>	Increased outcomes in achievement and attainment for pupils in receipt of free school meals.
Employment of part-time PSA to focus on targeted pupils / vulnerable families.  <b>20%</b>	Support for families whose children are in receipt of free school meals to enable increased outcomes for pupils.
CPD, visits, purchasing and training of interventions to improve achievement and attainment  <b>27%</b>	Increased outcomes in achievement and attainment for pupils in receipt of free school meals.
